CONDITIONS:

1. No exhibits in general ring events are to appear in the ring to be judged with any prize ribbon on, or with any distinguishing badge, under penalty of disqualification.
2. Mare with foal at foot, participating in the parade – foals must be led or under proper control.
3. Judges must make 1st, 2nd and 3rd awards (if worthy) in classes where stated.
4. In all classes where heights are quoted, competitors must be measured before going to the judge, must have a certificate from the measuring steward stating height and must produce the certificate before the prize ribbons are awarded if so requested by the ringmaster.
5. A parent or parents of a child shall not enter the show ring whilst the competitor is competing in any event unless authorised by the ringmaster. Any breach of this regulation, at the discretion of the ringmaster, may be investigated by a sub-committee, comprising the ringmaster and two committee members. The Sub Committee shall take whatever action it deems appropriate.
6. Owners of stallions will be responsible for the safekeeping of their animals.
7. Stallions may only compete in classes indicated for stallions.
8. Competitors with dogs on the ground are requested to keep them on a leash. Dogs found unleashed and/or out of control will be referred to the local council for impounding.
9. All horses competing at this Show compete on the understanding that drug testing may be carried out and if drugs are detected then penalties will apply.
10. To hold a Class there has to be more than two entries for prize money to be awarded.
11. **INDEMNITY AND WAIVER:** Each competitor **MUST** sign an Indemnity Waiver before entering the ring.
12. All competitors compete at their own risk. There will not under any circumstances be any Free Gate entry or any Gate Refund to Competitors.
13. Post entries to all sections apart from Campdrafting – Entries in Campdrafting to be in by Wednesday 27th January.
14. Horse stalls and stallion boxes are available on application and made on an official form. Payment must be made with application.
COST OF STALL: \$7.00 per horse for duration of show or \$4.00 per day per horse. Preference will be given in this order to visiting competitors, country competitors and then town competitors.
15. Camping Fees: \$5.00 per night per camp, which includes hot water for showers and electricity.
16. **Maiden** – is a pony, galloway or hack that has not won a first prize at any agricultural show.
17. **Novice** – is a pony, galloway or hack that has not won an open championship at any agricultural show.
18. **Intermediate** – is a pony, galloway or hack that has not won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place at a Royal Show.
19. Upon achieving an open saddle (ridden) championship in one ring, your horse/pony is not eligible to compete in any further saddle (ridden) classes on the day apart from the championship classes to be held after the Grand Parade.
20. The Society reserves the right to make any changes to this schedule without notice.

No liability for harm suffered from obvious risks of dangerous recreational activities

- (1) A person (“the defendant”) is not liable in negligence for harm suffered by another person (“the plaintiff”) as a result of the materialisation of an obvious risk of a dangerous recreational activity engaged by the plaintiff.
- (2) This section applies whether or not the plaintiff was aware of the risk.

CIVIL LIABILITY ACT 2002 – SECT 5M

No duty of care for recreational activity where risk warning

- (1) A person (“the defendant”) does not owe a duty of care to another person who engages in a recreational activity (“the plaintiff”) to take care in respect of a risk of the activity if the risk was the subject of a risk warning to the plaintiff.
- (2) If the person who suffers harm is an incapable person, the defendant may rely on a risk warning only if:
 - (a) the incapable person was under the control of or accompanied by another person (who is not an incapable person and not the defendant) and the risk was the subject of a risk warning to that other person, or
 - (b) The risk was the subject of a risk warning to a parent of the incapable person (whether or not the incapable person was under the control of or accompanied by the parent).
- (3) For the purpose of subsections (1) and (2), a risk warning to a person in relation to a recreational activity is a warning that is given in a manner that is reasonably likely to result in people being warned of the risk before engaging in the recreational activity. The defendant is not required to establish that the person received or understood the warning or was capable of receiving or understanding the warning.
- (4) A risk warning can be given orally or in writing (including by means of a sign or otherwise).
- (5) A risk warning need not be specific to the particular risk and can be a general warning of risks that include the particular risk concerned (so long as the risk warning warns of the general nature of the particular risk).
- (6) A defendant is not entitled to rely on a risk warning unless it is given by or on behalf of the defendant or by or on behalf of the occupier of the place where the recreational activity is engaged in.
- (7) A defendant is not entitled to rely on a risk warning if it is established (on the balance of probabilities) that the harm concerned resulted from a contravention of a provision of a written law of the State or Commonwealth that establishes specific practices or procedures for the protection of personal safety.
- (8) A defendant is not entitled to rely on a risk warning to a person to the extent that the warning was contradicted by any representation as to risk made by or on behalf of the defendant to the person.
- (9) A defendant is not entitled to rely on a risk warning if the plaintiff was required to engage in the recreational activity by the defendant.
- (10) The fact that a risk is the subject of a risk warning does not of itself mean:
 - (a) that the risk is not an obvious or inherent risk of an activity, or
 - (b) that a person who gives the risk warning owes a duty of care to a person who engages in an activity to take precautions to avoid the risk of harm from the activity.
- (11) This section does not limit or otherwise affect the effect of a risk warning in respect of a risk of an activity that is not a recreational activity.
- (12) In this section:

“incapable person” means a person who, because of the person’s age or physical or mental disability, lacks the capacity to understand the risk warning.

“parent” of an incapable person means any person (not being an incapable person) having parental responsibility for the incapable person.
